SCENIC VISTA DISC GOLF COURSE

The Columbiana County Park District's Scenic Vista Disc Golf Course is located three miles outside Lisbon. Opened in 2018, the 18-hole course is set in the moderately hilly, moderately wooded Scenic Vista Park.

The course tests the skill and stamina of all players by providing a constant challenge. Some holes require "boomer shots," while others call on the golfer to navigate between trees and shrubs. Par for all three levels is 64 for 18 holes.

There are three sets of tee pads (with the intermediate being concrete; the others are mulch), and the course length ranges from 5,500 feet for beginners to 8,421 feet for advanced players.

The course is managed by the Park District and no fee is charged to use it. The course was designed by disc golf professional J. Gary Dropcho and our own Jason Reynolds, who is a member of the park board of directors.

The first tournament – the Scenic Vista Challenge – was held in 2019. Other tournaments are planned.

Disc golf is one of the world's fastest growing sports. Today there are more than 2 million regular disc golfers in the U.S., and the number continues to increase. The sport is now played in more than 40 countries.

In disc golf, players compete by throwing a disc from a tee toward an elevated basket, usually at least 200 feet away. Players seek to finish a hole with the lowest number of total throws.

Players can use a variety of disc, including "drivers, midrange and putters." Discs have different weights and flight patterns, and can also come in a variety of plastics. A starter set of three retails for about \$20.

So come out and try your hand! There are several hotels/motels in the Lisbon area as well as a fine choice of restaurants and two microbreweries (one beer, one mead).

Co-designer of the Scenic Vista Disc Golf Course, J. Gary Dropcho is synonymous with disc golf in the Tri-state area. Dropcho is a professional disc golf course designer, promoter and player who has been active in the sport since 1984. Dropcho has designed 10 courses by himself and led the design on five others, including the four courses used in the 2015 PDGA Pro Disc Golf World Championships. He has founded and directed disc golf tournaments and events at the scholastic, collegiate and professional levels, and has been a leader in local, regional and national disc golf organizations. Dropcho has over 30 Professional Disc Golf Association wins. and was elected to the International Disc Golf Hall of Fame in 2015. He lives and plays disc golf in Wexford, Pennsylvania.
